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an introduction to crime and crime causation is a student friendly textbook that defines and explains the concepts of crime criminal law and criminology ideal for a one semester course the book compares and contrasts early criminal behavior and today s modern forms of crime it also explores society s responses to criminal behavior in the past and in the present day it covers both major and lesser known crime causation theories and their impact on society topics covered

include the importance of understanding crime data the goals of punishment the history of criminology including the influence of social darwinism on early trait theorists crime causation theories including a comparison of mainstream and critical theories the relationship between crime and biology including the influence of genetics substance use and mental illness the social structural approach to crime including a consideration of the changing contexts of urban criminality the nature and function of the justice system at the local state and federal levels and basic categories of crimes drug trafficking crimes drug court efforts and perceived weaknesses in current antidrug efforts each chapter begins with a set of objectives and concludes with a summary interactive questions promote classroom discussion and practicum sections facilitate contextual learning drawn from different and distinct backgrounds the authors each have unique perspectives on crime making for a particularly well rounded text that explores crime from several angles the book attempts to educate readers in the development of new insights on crime and crime causation and provides a greater understanding of the steps that need to be taken before a significant reduction in crime can occur

the book provides a critical analysis of eu law making policy on the confiscation of the proceeds of crime using a minimalist restorative approach to justice focused on the rights of victims and communities and more proactive roles for all participants in confiscation procedures this book shows how the examined policy has been translated into the eu law standards adopted as its realisation and whether the gaps identified in these standards are reflected in the domestic law of the comparator eu jurisdictions poland germany and france the post conviction confiscation regime in england and wales is also explored as an example of an alternative non eu model of value based confiscation considering the complex juridical nature of confiscation which challenges the applicability of the civil criminal dichotomy this book recommends a twofold approach when shaping eu confiscation mechanisms focused on linking policy objectives with a restorative approach to justice and making the appropriate choice of criminal or civil routes for confiscation this book will be of key interest to scholars students and practitioners in eu policy and law criminal law eu and national law on confiscation eu criminal justice policy and more broadly to european studies criminology and international organisations

why have many victim centred policy initiatives met with so little success how have those initiatives unfolded differently in different global jurisdictions over different periods of time this book aims to address these questions building on a major research project exploring victims access to justice over time and place victims access to justice considers the potentialities for victims participation in criminal justice systems and in victim programmes both in historical and comparative context it considers a range of topics ways of identifying and accommodating victims needs and senses of justice the impacts for criminal justice systems of seeking to accommodate these and the ways in which adversarial criminal justice systems in particular may enable or inhibit victim participation this is essential reading for all those engaged in understanding and working with victims of crime
